ATTACHMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF

ANDREW T. HUBER, M.D., INC., A Professional Medical Corporation

7. Statutory Close Corporation.

This corporation is a close corporation. All the corporation's issued shares of stock, of all classes, shall be held of record by not more than thirty-five (35) persons.

8. Share Restrictions.

This corporation is subject to the restrictions on the qualifications of shareholders imposed by Title 1, Division 3, Part 4 of the California Corporations Code and other applicable laws, rules, and regulations, which provide that only the following may be shareholders of a medical corporation:

- (i) Holders of a valid physician's and surgeon's certificate issued by the Division of Licensing of the Medical Board of California;
- (ii) Licensed persons as defined in Section 13401.5(a) of the California Corporations Code, provided that (i) the number of shares in the Corporation owned by such persons does not exceed 49 percent of the total shares issued by the Corporation; and (ii) the number of such persons owning shares in the Corporation does not exceed the number of licensed physician and surgeons owning shares in the Corporation; and
- (iii) Medical corporations with only one shareholder, who is a licensed person as defined in Section 13401 of the California Corporations Code.

9. Hold Harmless; Indemnification.

- (a) The liability of directors of the corporation for monetary damages shall be eliminated to the fullest extent permissible under Section 204(a)(10) of the California Corporations Code. The corporation is authorized to indemnify the directors of the corporation to the fullest extent permissible under Section 204(a)(10) of the California Corporations Code.
- (b) The corporation is authorized to provide indemnification of agents (as defined in Section 317 of the California Corporations Code) for breach of duty to the corporation and its stockholders through Bylaw provisions, agreements with agents, vote of shareholders or disinterested directors, or otherwise to the fullest extent permissible under California law, in excess of the indemnification otherwise permitted by Section 317 of the California Corporations Code, subject to the limits on such excess indemnification set forth in Section 204 of the California Corporations Code.
- (c) Any amendment, repeal, or modification of any provision of this Article 9 shall not adversely affect any right or protection of an agent of this corporation existing at the time of such amendment, repeal, or modification.
