ATTACHMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF STONEWORKERS ALLIED FOR EQUITY

Additional Statements

Paragraph 1. The specific and primary purpose of this corporation is to further charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or the corresponding provisions of any future United States internal revenue law (the "Code").

Paragraph 2. This corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code. Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, this corporation shall not carry on any activities that are not permitted to be carried on by (1) a corporation that is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, or (2) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Sections 170(c)(2), 2055(a)(2), 2106(a)(2)(A)(ii), 2522(a)(2), or 2522(b)(2) of the Code.

Paragraph 3. Except as permitted by Section 501(h) of the Code, no substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation.

Paragraph 4. This corporation shall not participate in or intervene in (including the publication or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Paragraph 5. The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Code, and no part of the net earnings or assets of this corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member (if any) of this corporation, except that the corporation shall be authorized to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of its purposes set forth in Paragraph 1 above.

Paragraph 6. Upon the winding up and dissolution of this corporation, and after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of this corporation, the remaining net assets shall be distributed to (A) a nonprofit fund, foundation, or corporation which is (i) organized and operated exclusively for charitable or educational purposes and (ii) that has established its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code or (B) to the United States government or to a state or local government described in Section 170(c)(1) of the Code, for public purposes.
