ATTACHMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

<u>OF</u>

FREEMAN DOCTOR OF PHYSICAL THERAPY, INC.

The Articles of Incorporation of this corporation shall include the following provisions:

<u>Limitation of Liability of Directors.</u> The liability of the directors of the Corporation for monetary damages shall be eliminated to the fullest extent permissible under California law.

<u>Indemnification</u>. The Corporation is authorized to provide indemnification of agents (as defined in Section 317 of the California Corporations Code) for breach of duty to the Corporation and its shareholders through bylaw provisions or through agreements with agents, or both, in excess of the indemnification otherwise permitted by Section 317 of the California Corporations Code, subject to the limits on such excess indemnification set forth in Section 204 of the California Corporations Code.
