Additional Provisions - B99Voters Project

This corporation is organized exclusively for the promotion of social welfare as defined under Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except as reasonable compensation for services rendered or as payments and distributions in furtherance of the corporation's exempt purposes.

The corporation may engage in lobbying and political activities as permitted under Section 501(c)(4), provided that such activities do not become its primary purpose.

The corporation may have members as defined in its Bylaws, with their rights and responsibilities determined by the Bylaws.

Upon dissolution, any remaining assets shall be distributed exclusively for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code or to the federal, state, or local government for a public purpose. The corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted for organizations exempt under Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code.
