Articles of Incorporation-Additional Provisions

The following provisions are hereby incorporated into the attached ARTS-GS for SEALCO INC.

- A. The liability of directors of the corporation for monetary damages shall be eliminated to the fullest extent permissible under California law.
- B. The corporation is authorized to provide indemnification of agents (as defined in Section 317 of the California Corporations Code) for breach of duty to the corporation and its shareholders through bylaw provisions or through agreements with such agents, or both, in excess of the indemnification otherwise permitted by Section 317 of the Corporations Code, subject to the limits of such excess indemnification set forth on Section 204 of the Corporations Code.
