The name of this corporation is "YOUTH SOLUTIONS FOUNDATION".

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

- A. This corporation is a nonprofit public benefit corporation and is not organized for the private gain of any person. It is organized under the Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law of California for public and charitable purposes.
- B. This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as now enacted or hereafter amended, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that also qualify as Section 501(c)(3) exempt organizations, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. To this end, the Corporation shall operate exclusively for charitable purposes to preserve communities impacted by the LA Wildfires and empowering wildfire survivors to rebuild, not sell, and through advocacy, financial assistance, and education, we provide the resources necessary for individuals to reclaim their homes, restore their land, and strengthen their communities for generations to come.

Upon the dissolution or winding up of the corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of this corporation shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code.
